### Where are Community Navigators located?


Statewide, over 100 organizations are available to provide business support and assistance.



# Advantage Illinois (AI) Participation Loan Program

DCEO partners with approved lenders to assist small businesses obtain loans at lower interest rates.

- Funding can be used for but not limited to:
  - Working Capital
  - Equipment
  - Real Estate (must be 51% or more occupied by the business)
- Job creation requirement
- Program limited to eligible businesses (for-profit)

## Pre-Qualification Requirements

Steps to get pre-qualified for State of Illinois programs



## <u>Incentives</u>

**EDGE:** Provides an annual tax credit equal to 50% of the new full-time employees' payroll withholding tax for 10 years to companies which create new jobs and make capital investments.

**Enterprise Zones:** Available to companies located in specific areas, Enterprise Zones provide various benefits including building material sales tax exemptions, utility tax exemptions (natural gas and electricity), and investment tax credits.

**Angel Tax Credit:** Encourages investment in innovative, early-stage companies to help them obtain the working capital needed to further their growth in Illinois. Investors in certified companies can apply for a state tax credit equal to 25% of their investment.

# Illinois Department of Central Management Services (CMS): Business Enterprise Program (BEP)

- Help businesses become certified as minority-owned businesses (minorities, women, veteran and persons with disabilities).
- Process is FREE of charge.
- Eligibility
  - At least 51% owned and controlled by a minority or demographic group
  - Owner is a US citizen or permanent resident
  - Annual gross of business is under \$75 million
